THE SERMON

We stand

THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Let us declare our faith in God.

We believe in one God,

the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,

of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,

the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father,

God from God, Light from Light,

true God from true God, begotten, not made,

of one Being with the Father;

through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary

and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son,

who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The prayer continues and concludes with the doxology where we respond, *Amen*

Postlude

Verse in G Major John Blow 1649-1708

John Blow was an English composer and organist of the Baroque period. Appointed organist of Westminster Abbey in late 1668, his pupils included William Croft, Jeremiah Clarke and Henry Purcell. In 1685 he was named a private musician to James II. In 1687, he became choirmaster at St Paul's Cathedral, where many of his pieces were performed. In 1699 he was appointed to the newly created post of Composer to the Chapel Royal. Blow wrote fourteen services, odes for royal celebrations, secular songlike pieces and more than a hundred anthems. In addition to ecclesiastical music Blow's works include 'Great sir, the joy of all our hearts', an ode for New Year's Day 1682, similar compositions in subsequent years and odes for the celebration of St Cecilia's Day. He composed two anthems for the coronation of James II: 'Behold, O God, our Defender' and 'God spake sometime in visions;'
