THE SERMON

We stand

THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Let us declare our faith in God.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son,

who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Presentation of the Gifts

During the Offertory hymn the bread and wine and the collection are brought to the altar and the altar is prepared.

This is a setting of a Lutheran Hymn dating from the late 17th Century. The text asks that the Lord Jesus will lead us in his holy ways, to fill our hearts with fervent zeal, to learn his truth and do God's will. Johann Gottfried Walthier was the cousin of Johann Sebastian Bach and was most well-known for his compilation: Musicalisches Lexicon which defines over three thousand musical terms. In addition, among many transcriptions of concertos by Vivaldi, Telemann and others, he composed 132 organ preludes based on Lutheran chorale melodies.
